Kailynne God's Beloved

Kailynne is new to the Elevation family, and is our youngest student. Historically, The Fold Family Ministries has served "troubled teens;" in our increasingly broken world, more children are being born into traumatic and broken circumstances, and without loving intervention, they are on a path to being troubled as teenagers as well as adults. One's identity is most often forged by one's upbringing, and Kailynne's journey of "neither parent being capable of providing adequate care" has fostered a sense of abandonment and bitterness. We are truly blessed to be able to come around Kailynne to wrap her in the love of Christ and counter her Adverse Childhood Experiences. By completely immersing her in Christ's love, like a sponge in the ocean, Kailynne will be able to claim her belovedness. Research studies confirm that exposure to severe trauma places children at-risk of turning to negative coping mechanisms, such as substance use and toxic relationships, to cope with stressful events (Jonson-Reid, Kohl, & Drake, 2012). We are so excited for all God has planned in Kailynne's life. By faith, we believe that as she learns to claim her belovedness, her identity in Christ will be secure.
